1. Exhibitors must be 8-21 years of age. Exhibitors are NOT required to be a 4-H or FFA member. Classes are open to youth in Miller County and adjoining and reciprocating counties, with the exception of classes 102, 112, 122, 132, 162, 172, and 182, which are first and second year 4-H or FFA members only. Proof of reciprocation must be presented to the chairperson.
2. Ponies will be measured.
3. Youth showing in walk-trot classes CANNOT show in horsemanship classes that will canter.
4. Half of arena may be used at judge's discretion.
5. All rules set forth in the Central Region 4-H Rulebook will apply. If in doubt about these rules, please obtain a copy from your Extension Office or your project leader prior to the show.
6. No stallions may be shown.
7. 4-H classes require that you have met your individual 4-H club attendance requirements to be eligible to show. 4-H age is: "must have passed 8th birthday by January 1, 2011 and not have passed 19th birthday by January 1st 2011."
8. Premiums will be \$5 - \$3 - \$2. Ribbons will be awarded through six (6) places and will be paid at the conclusion of the show.
9. All entries in classes MUST be completed with the registration desk at least ONE class ahead. (Ex. If you want to enter class 13, you MUST be entered in class 13 before class 12 enters the ring to show.) Entries may scratch one class prior to the class entered in.
10. Awards will be presented to class winners listed in rule number 1.
11. An exhibitor may show only once in each class, including only one horsemanship class and one timed class.
12. Horse leaders in lead classes must be at least 16 years of age.
13. Entry fee will be \$2.00 per class. Admission fee is \$2.00.
14. Missouri Department of Health Regulations applies to all entries. All horses MUST have a Coggins test.
15. Safety helmets must be worn by all speed event riders.
16. Management reserves the right to combine, change, or cancel classes.
17. Horses must be under control at all times. Kickers must be marked by red ribbon. Any horse endangering another horse, rider, show official, or spectator will be excused from the show/class. Illness, lameness, unruliness, or signs thereof are grounds for dismissal from the ring.
18. Children must be supervised at all times and there is absolutely no climbing on fences or gates.
19. No dogs allowed.
20. Good sportsmanship is expected of all participants and spectators.
21. Not responsible for accidents.

Country Cured Hams

1. Exhibitors must be current FFA or 4-H members.
2. Hams must have been federally inspected in origin or curing to be eligible to sell at the sale.
3. Class 115 is smoked hams. Class 116 is non-smoked.
4. Each exhibitor will be allowed to exhibit a total of two (2) hams per class, but only sell one (1).
5. The top 15 overall hams will be eligible to be auctioned at the livestock sale.
6. Entries will be taken from 5 p.m. – 8 p.m. on Sunday, July 17, 2011 and 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m., Tuesday, July 19, 2011. Hams will be released Friday, July 22, 2011 after 6pm.
7. Premiums are \$6-\$4-\$2 for blue, red, and white ribbons.

Junior Rabbit Department
Chairperson

1. Exhibitors must be 8 – 21 years of age, with the exception of Clover Kids who compete for ribbons only. Exhibitors of an adjoining county MUST be a member of a 4-H club or FFA chapter. Exhibitors of Miller County are NOT required to be a 4-H or FFA member, except for the market rabbit class.
2. All known standard breeds recognized by the American Rabbit Breeds Association may be shown.
3. All rabbits must be owned by the exhibitor.
4. Each exhibitor can show an unlimited number in each individual class.
5. Entry fee is \$1.00 per rabbit.
6. All rabbits will be inspected upon arrival at the show and stock received in an unsound condition will be returned at once.
7. Each exhibitor will need to bring their rabbits in their own cages. Cages will NOT be provided.
8. All rabbits are released at noon following the poultry show. NO rabbits are to remain on the fairgrounds, except for the market rabbits that are eligible for the sale.
9. Meat pens shall consist of three rabbits, all of the same breed and variety. Meat pen does not necessarily have to come from the same litter. Age limit is 10 weeks. Minimum weight is 3 lbs. each. Maximum weight is 5 lbs. each. All rabbits must be weighed in the presence of the judge.
10. All animals shown in the Miller County Youth Fair will be subject to use for the Youth Judging Contest.
11. Clover Kids may compete for ribbons only and are ages 5-8.

A rabbit knowledge test will be given for those wishing to participate. Prizes will be given for the top three scores.

Grand and Reserve Champion pen of three rabbits will be sold at the livestock sale.

Meat rabbits eligible for sale are to remain on the fairgrounds until sale.

Grand and Reserve meat pens and the Grand & Reserve Doe and Grand & Reserve Buck will be awarded premiums.

1. Exhibitors must be 8 – 21 years of age, with exception of Clover Kids (age 5-8) who compete for ribbons only. Exhibitors of an adjoining county MUST be a member of a 4-H club or FFA chapter. Exhibitors of Miller County are NOT required to be a 4-H or FFA member, except for the market poultry class.
2. Breeds will be Standard Breed (S), Bantam Breed (B), Waterfowl (Ducks or Geese (W), All other breeds (Guinea Fowl, peafowl, turkey, pigeon, and others) (O).
3. All poultry must be owned by the exhibitor by May 1.
4. Each exhibitor can show an unlimited number in each individual class.
5. Entry fee is \$2.00 per bird.
6. Premiums will be \$4-\$3-\$2 for blue, red, and white ribbons.
7. Grand and Reserve Grand Champions premiums will be \$10 and \$5.
8. All poultry will be inspected upon arrival at the show and stock received in an unsound condition will be returned at once.
9. Leg bands are recommended for identification purposes for all birds.
10. Each exhibitor will need to bring their poultry in their own cages. Cages will NOT be provided.
11. All poultry are released at the conclusion of the show. NO poultry are to remain on the fairgrounds, except for the market chickens that are eligible for the sale.
12. Meat pens shall consist of four chickens, all of the same breed and variety. Weigh-in will take place during the poultry show registration in the presence of the judge. Weights and ages are as follows:
 - a. Market broilers, less than 70 days, 3 to 5 pounds
 - b. Market ducks, less than 90 days, 3 to 5 pounds
 - c. Market Turkey, approximately 16 to 20 weeks, 20 to 25 pounds
13. All animals shown in the Miller County Youth Fair will be subject to use for the Youth Judging Contest.

1. Intrastate (Poultry and waterfowl in Missouri moving for exhibition only)
 - a. All poultry and waterfowl to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of any infectious or contagious disease.
 - b. No Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required.
 - c. Pullorum-Typhroid test – All poultry (except waterfowl) exhibited shall be tested negative for pullorum-typhoid within (90) days prior to exhibition or originate from a flock approved by the National Poultry Improvement Plan or an equivalent program which has been tested within the past 12 months with no change of ownership. This information shall be documented on a VS Form 9-2 or similar certificate which shall accompany the poultry to the exhibition and shall be made available on request/
2. Requirements for Sponsoring Exhibitions for Poultry and Waterfowl
 - a. An official representing the person or organization sponsoring the exhibition shall notify the state veterinarian no later than thirty days prior to the exhibition giving the names, place, inclusive dates and times of event.
 - b. Record Keeping: The sponsor of the exhibition shall compile a list of all poultry and waterfowl present at the exhibition . The list shall contain the name and address of each owner, the number, species, breed, variety, type, sex, and pullorumtyphoid status of all poultry present. A copy of this list shall be retained by the sponsor of the exhibition for at least twelve months and shall be made available upon request to a representative of the department.
 - c. Inspection: All poultry and waterfowl to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of any infectious or contagious disease. A representative of the department shall have access to the exhibits and may conduct inspections and test as deemed necessary.

General regulations for Sheep/Goat show

1. Exhibitors must reside in Miller and adjoining counties.
2. All exhibitors must be in 8-21 years of age. Breeding stock classes-exhibitors are NOT required to be 4-H or FFA members. Market classes – exhibitors must be 4-H or FFA member in Miller County.
3. All exhibitors will furnish their own feed and containers. Bedding will be provided. Exhibitor may bring additional bedding, but NO STRAW ALLOWED. Entry fee is \$5.00 per head.
4. Each exhibitor will be limited to two (2) entries in each breeding class.
5. All exhibitors MUST show their OWN animals in the showmanship class.
6. Four places will be given in each class. \$10 - \$8 - \$6 - \$4
7. Market lamb market goat class is for Miller County 4-Hand FFA members and adjoining counties that are reciprocal. Reciprocating counties must provide proof of ownership by county specialist prior to show. Reciprocating county exhibitors are limited to one (1) market lamb entry
8. Weight limited on the market lamb class will be a minimum of 90 lbs. class weight breaks will be determined at the discretion of the chairman, after the weigh-in to create equal classes. The top animal from each class will compete for grand and reserve market lamb.
9. All market lambs and market goats will remain at the fairgrounds from Tuesday until the sale of Friday.
10. Missouri Department of Health regulations apply to all entries.
11. All animals of any recognized breed will be judged separately in each breed class
12. Any animal appearing to be hazardous, uncontrollable, or disruptive to the show, in the opinion of three (3) person committee will be excused and will be asked to vacate the fairgrounds. No calming chemicals are to be used on beef, sheep, swine, or goats while on Miller County Fairground premises.
13. No drug use of any kind will be allowed on any market animal during the Miller County Fair. Drug use will cause disqualification of the animal. If an animal is condemned due to drug residues, the exhibitor will refund the purchase price of the animal and forfeit all prize money.
14. Beginner's show class will be judged under the Danish system. There will be no paid premiums and no entry fees.
15. All other classes will be judged under the open system.
16. All breeding animals, with the exception of market lambs and commercial ewes, entered and shown must be registered or nominated in their respective breed association and must be recorded in exhibitor's name at the home office of said association. Papers supporting this requirement must be available for the chairman to check at unloading.
17. All market lambs and market goats MUST be weighed in and ear tagged for ownership verification on May 15 2011, from 8a.m. to 10 a.m. at the Miller County Fairgrounds.
18. Exhibitors may weigh in a maximum of two (2) market lambs and/or market goats or one (1) market lamb and/or market goats per exhibitor in a family with

- one (1) reserve lamb per family (household). Exhibitors may show both market lambs, providing they are not in the same weight class, but sell only one (1).
19. All males must be clearly castrated prior to ear tagging date.
 20. Market animals must be sheared and **dry** at weigh-in and weigh-off. No sweats on animals when weighing .
 21. Market lambs weighing less than 90 lbs will be eligible to show in the feeder lamb class, instead of the market lamb classes, for ribbons only, but will NOT be eligible to sell.
 22. Market goats weighing 40 lbs or less will be eligible to show in the feeder goat class, instead of the market goat class, for ribbons only, but will NOT be eligible to sell.
 23. Rate of gain will be computed and premiums given for the highest five (5) placing market lambs.
 24. Market lambs must be nose printed for the State Fair by the county representative at the spring weigh-in and will be mailed by the representative.
 25. All animals shown in the Miller County Youth Fair will be subject to use for the Youth Judging Contest.
 26. NO BRACING of market goats in the show ring.
 27. There will be open classes for exhibition only.
 28. Premiums will be \$10-\$8-\$6-\$4.
 29. In the championship drive, an overall grand and reserve will be selected. If either of these are out-of-county, the remaining out-of-county animals will be removed from the arena and any qualifying in-county animals will be brought to the arena for the selection of the in-county grand and reserve champions.

General Regulations for Swine Show

1. Exhibitors must reside in Miller and adjoining reciprocating counties.
2. All exhibitors must be 8 – 21 years of age. Breeding stock classes – exhibitors are NOT required to be a 4-H or FFA member. Market classes – exhibitors MUST be Miller County 4-H or FFA members to sell.
3. All exhibitors will furnish their own feed and containers. Exhibitor may bring bedding, but NO STRAW ALLOWED. Entry fee is \$5 per head.
4. All stalls are to be cleaned by 5 p.m. so area will be clean for evening visitors.
5. All trailers and feed vehicles must be kept away from the barns from 5 p.m. until release of livestock. A designated parking area will be posted. This is to allow adequate room for evening fair visitors.
6. All exhibitors will be required to clean their own pens at the conclusion of the fair or forfeit their premium money.
7. Each exhibitor will be limited to two (2) entries in each individual breeding class.
8. All breeding animals entered and shown must be registered or nominated in their respective breed association and must be recorded in exhibitors name at the home office or said association. Papers supporting this requirement must be available for the chairperson to check at unloading time.
9. All entries must be farrowed in the month they are exhibited.
10. Exhibitors will be required to show animals unassisted unless prior permission of chairperson.
11. All exhibitors **must** show their **own** animals in the Showmanship Class.
12. Any misrepresentation of said exhibitors shall be cause for disqualification.
13. Where there are only one or two exhibitors entered in a class or a class is not full, animals will be rewarded first, second, third, or no premium according to their merit.
14. Any dispute in the interpretation of the rules shall be referred to the chairperson whose decision shall be final.
15. All exhibitors will be required to keep the wash rack doors closed when washing hogs.
16. Once pen rent has been paid there will be no refunds.
17. Exhibitors will be required to enter pigs by class number. Once entries close no class changes will be made.
18. No feed or water will be allowed in the pens from the hours of 5 p.m. through 9 p.m.
19. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning the alley in front of their pen daily.
20. Premiums will be \$10 - \$8 - \$6 - \$4.

21. All classes will be showed under the open system, with the exception of the Beginner's Show Class, which will be judged under the Danish System. There will be no paid premium and no entry fee for the Beginner's Show Class.
22. Any animal appearing to be hazardous, uncontrollable, or disruptive to the show, in the opinion of a three (3) person committee, will be excused and will be asked to vacate the fairgrounds. No calming chemicals are to be used on beef, sheep, and swine while on Miller County Fairgrounds premises.
23. No hogs will be loaded before the end of the show.
24. Breeding stock must be in place on the fairgrounds by 8 a.m. on July 20, 2011.
25. Market Hogs will show first, followed by the breeding stock.
26. A Herdsmanship plaque will be awarded to the exhibitor with the outstanding swine exhibit. A committee will make inspections to determine the winner. The following points will be considered: (1) cleanliness, grooming, and appearance of the exhibit; (2) handling of feed, equipment, etc. and keeping of those items out of the alleys; and (3) cooperation, courtesy, and sportsmanship in the exhibit area and show ring.
27. All animals shown in the Miller County Youth Fair will be subject to use for the Youth Judging Contest.
28. Engorging animals with water or any filling substance/material by means of hoses, pipes, pumps, etc. is prohibited on the fairgrounds and will result in dismissal from show and sale.
29. At least two exhibitors with animals in a specific breed will establish a breed class.

Market Hog Class Regulations

1. The Market Hog is for Miller County 4-H and FFA members and adjoining counties who are reciprocal. Reciprocating counties must provide proof of ownership by county youth specialist prior to the show. Reciprocating county exhibitors are limited to one (1) market hog entry.
2. The top two market hogs from each class will show for champion and reserve market hog.
3. All entries must be owned by the exhibitors and proof furnished to the swine chairman.
4. All exhibitors will be required to clean their own pens at the conclusion of the fair or forfeit their premium money.
5. Market hogs can be purebred or crossbred.
6. Entries must be owned by weigh-in date and must be weighed on this date to be eligible to enter the Market Hog Class at the fair.
7. Exhibitors are allowed to show only one market hog per class with maximum at two (2).
8. All exhibitors **must** show their **own** animals in the Showmanship Class.
9. Exhibitors will be responsible for getting their market hogs to the scales for weighing, for class placings, and for electronic carcass measurements.
10. Pig must be washed and clean in order to be numbered at the scale. Do not wash number off the pig after he has been numbered. The exhibitor will be responsible to see that the number is legible at show time.
11. The market hog has to weigh a minimum of 200 lbs. and 310 lbs. maximum to be eligible for the market hog show and sale. Any hog with a weight of 199 lbs. or less, or 311 lbs. or more will be eligible to show in pre-market and post-market hog classes for ribbons only.
12. Weight classes will be determined after all Market Hogs have been weighed.
13. Exhibitors may weigh in a maximum of two (2) market hogs, or one market hog per exhibitor in a family with one (1) reserve market hog per family (household), but only show one.
14. Market hogs must be ear notched or an ear tag will be provided at the weigh-in for identification purposes.
15. Missouri Department of Health Regulations applies to all entries.
16. No drug use of any kind will be allowed on any market animal during the Miller County Fair. Drug use will cause disqualification of the animal. If the animal is condemned due to drug residues, the exhibitor will refund the purchase price of animal and forfeit all prize money.
17. All market hog exhibitors must be Missouri Show-Me Quality Standards certified for the animal to be sold at the auction.
18. Gilts may be shown in a market hog class or a breeding stock class, but not both.
19. There are to be no unattended water pans in the show barn stall area.

20. All animals shown in the Miller County Youth Fair will be subject to use for the Youth Judging Contest.
21. There will be a Pee-Wee class for ages 7 & under before the first class of hogs.
22. In the championship drive, an overall grand and reserve will be selected. If either of these are out-of-county, the remaining out-of-county animals will be removed from the arena and any qualifying in-county animals will be brought to the arena for the selection of the in-county grand and reserve champions.

General Regulations for Junior Beef Show

1. Exhibitors must reside in Miller County and adjoining counties.
2. All exhibitors must be 8-21 years of age. Breeding Stock Classes- Exhibitors **NOT** required being in 4-H or FFA members. Market Classes- Exhibitors **MUST BE** 4-H or FFA members to show.
3. Pens available following the dairy show.
4. All exhibitors will furnish their own feed and containers. Bedding will be provided. Exhibitors may bring additional bedding, but **NO STRAW ALLOWED**. Entry fee in \$5 per head.
5. Breeding animals must presented registration papers on all animals exhibited that are purebred. Unless otherwise designated all breeding classes are for registered animals. Animals must be recorded in the name of the junior class exhibitor.
6. A "Commercial" heifer class has been designated for beef heifers of mixed percentage, or that are in an upgrading program.
7. Each exhibitor will be limited to two entries in each individual breeding class.
8. All exhibitors **MUST** show their **OWN** animals in the Showmanship Class.
9. Any animals appearing to be hazardous, uncontrollable, or disruptive to the show, in the opinion of the three people committee, will be excused and will be asked to vacate the fairgrounds. No claming chemicals are used on beef, swine, or sheep while on the Miller County Fairgrounds premises.
10. The champion of each breeding class will receive a plaque.
11. Premiums will be \$10-\$8-\$6-\$4.
12. All exhibitors will be required to show animals unassisted.
13. All classes will be showed under open system, with the exception of the Beginner's Show Class, which will be judged under the Danish system. There will me **NO** entry fee for the Beginner's Show Class.
14. Missouri Department of health Regulations applies to all entries.
15. A Herdsmanship plaque will be awarded to the exhibitor with the outstanding beef cattle exhibit. A committee will make inspections of determine the winners. The following points will be considered: (1) cleanness, grooming, and appearance of the exhibits. (2) Handling of the feed, equipment, ECT. And keeping theses items out of the alleys. And (3) cooperation, courtesy, and sportsmanship in the exhibit area and the show ring.
16. All animals shown in the Miller County Youth Fair will be subjected to use for the Youth Judging Contest.

17. Rosettes will be given for all breed champion bulls and females with trophies to supreme bull and female.
18. Engorging animals with water or any filling substance/material by means of hoses, pipes, pumps, etc. is prohibited on the fairgrounds and will result in dismissal from show and sale.

Market Beef Class Regulations

1. The market beef class is for Miller County 4-H Club and FFA Chapter members and adjoining counties who are reciprocating.
2. Reciprocation County must provide proof of ownership by county youth specialist prior to show. Reciprocation county exhibitors are limited to one (1) steer/market heifer entry.
3. All exhibitors will furnish their own feed and containers. Bedding will be provided. Exhibitors may bring extra bedding. But NO STRAW IS ALLOWED. Entry fee if \$5 per head.
4. All steers/market heifers must be weighted at the spring weigh-in to be eligible to enter the Market Beef Class.
5. Only two (2) steers/market heifers may be weighed in at the spring weigh-in.
6. Exhibitors may weigh in a maximum of two (2) two market steers, or one market steer per exhibitor in a family with one (1) reserve market steer per family (household). Exhibitors may show both market steers, providing they are different weigh classes, but they sell one.
7. At weigh-off at the fair all steers may be mouthed for age. Any steer that has shed their baby teeth and its two year old teeth will not be allowed to show or sell.
8. All market animals will be judged and placed on hoof by the judge. ADG will be computed on each animal but will be considered as a part of the ton on hoof evaluation.
9. Any animal appearing to be hazardous, uncontrollable, or disruptive to the show, in the opinion of a three (3)-person committee, will be asked to vacate the fairgrounds.
10. Exhibitors will be required to show animals unassisted.
11. All exhibitors MUST show their OWN animals in the Showmanship Class.
12. Class weigh breaks will be determined after the weigh-off to create equal classes as determined by the chairman. The top two animals from each class will compete for Grand and Reserve Champion.
13. The Missouri Department of Health Regulations apply to all entries.
14. No drug use of any kind will be allowed on any market animal during the Miller County Fair. Drug use will cause disqualification of the animal. If any animal is condemned due to drug residues exhibitors will refund the purchase price of the animal and forfeit all prize money.
15. All beef cattle must be haltered and tied, as well as have a neck tie. Nothing sharp is allowed on the halter.
16. The market beef sale is for Miller County 4-H and FFA members only.
17. The minimum weight for a market steer/heifer to be eligible to sell is 850lbs. The maximum weight is 1500lbs to be eligible to sell.
18. Any market steer/heifer weighing 849lbs or less at the time of weigh-off will eligible to show in the Prospect Market Class for ribbons only and will

- not be eligible to sell. Any market steer/heifer weighing 1501 lbs or more will be eligible to show in the Post Market Class for ribbons only.
19. Animals must be steered and dehorned prior to spring weigh-in.
 20. Market steers must be nose printed for the State Fair will be nose printed by the county representative at the spring weigh-in and will be mailed by the representative.
 21. In the championship drive, an overall grand and reserve will be selected. If either of these are out-of-county, the remaining out-of-county animals will be removed from the arena and any qualifying in-county animals will be brought to the arena for the selection of the in-county grand and reserve champions.

1. All sales are limited to members of Miller County 4-H and FFA clubs.
2. Steers, market hogs, market lambs, market goats, market rabbits, market chickens, and hams will be limited to selling two (2) items in the sale. Pen of meat rabbits and meat chickens are considered (1) sale animal. A ham will also be considered (1) one sale item. Exhibitors may not sell two (2) items in any one category.
3. Sale order will be determined by official placings in each individual show. At the sale the order will be as follows: rabbits, poultry, hams, market goats, market lambs, market hogs, market steers.
4. All animals that will not be sold on Friday July 22, 2011, must be removed from the fairgrounds by 10:00 a.m., Friday, July 22, 2011.
5. Exhibitors will be responsible for the delivery of their animals to location of the buyer's choice.
6. No animals at the sale are to be removed until released by the committee member assigned to the steer, market hog, or market lamb sections. Exhibitors will be told who these people are before the sale.
7. Checks from the sale of animals will not be issued on sale day, but WILL BE MAILED to each exhibitor.
8. 3% of sale fee will be deducted for sale committee use.
9. No animal will be sold without release forms signed by owners. Release forms will be available at least two (2) hours prior to sale-by-sale chairman or committee.
10. The exhibitor will be present and will lead or drive and show their animals in the sale ring. In emergency situations, at the discretion of the sale committee, another exhibitor may show to sell for another exhibitor.
11. No drug use of any kind will be allowed on any market animal during the Miller County Youth Fair. Drug use will cause disqualifications of the animal. If an animal is condemned due to drug residues, exhibitor will refund purchase price of animal and forfeit all prize money.
12. The sale price from the buyer will be for the premiums (difference of floor and sale price of the animal). The sale will also alternate swine, beef, and

- others (rabbits, hams, goats, sheep) throughout the sale. The grand and reserve champions of all will be sold first.
13. The Floor Sale Committee consisting of four members will be established at the rules meeting each year.
 14. Retained ownership is when an animal is sold only for the premium. Retained ownership must be known by the show chairman by the end of the show in order for the animal to be labeled in the sale booklet.

Miller County Fair Livestock Rules Meeting Minutes
January 5, 2011
6:30pm

The meeting was called to order by Willard Haley. There was a brief review of the by-laws and the voting delegates were determined.

Financial Report

Matt Davis presented the profit/loss statement for the fair. There was discussion about the fair being in debt. Colleen Abbott moved that exhibitors pre-register for the fair (by July 1st), that all exhibitors buy a \$5 exhibitor pass, that all bottle calves, cattle, swine, goats, and sheep have a \$5/head entry fee, and that the late fee be \$5 if registering after July 1st. It was seconded by Jason Long and motion passed.

Tagging and Weigh-in times

Scratched gate pass on page 2. Update dates and add KS95 Versailles as the radio station for cancellations for weigh-in due to inclement weather.

Update entry fees to \$5 except poultry (\$2) and rabbits (\$1).

Jason Long moved to have rabbits and poultry entry fees raised to \$2 with a late fee of \$2 and for the premiums to be \$5-\$4-\$3-\$2-\$1 for placing. Second by Colleen Abbott. Motion passed. This was changed later in the meeting (see under poultry) and the rabbits remain at a \$1 entry fee with premiums staying the same. Poultry premiums will be \$4 – Blue, \$3 – Red, \$1 White, with the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champions receiving \$10 & \$5, respectfully.

Jason Long moved to release rabbits & poultry to noon in order to get ribbons placed on pens. Motion passed.

Horse Show

No chairpersons present. No changes.

Hams

Colleen Abbott moved to lower ham premiums to \$6-\$4-\$2 for blue, red, and white. Jennifer Kempker seconded. Motion failed.

Ron Schneider moved a \$2 entry fee per ham and a \$6-\$4-\$2 premium.

Gary Looten seconded. Motion failed.

Mike Kriehauser moved to set ham premiums at \$6-\$4-\$2. Colleen Abbott seconded. Motion passed.

Rabbits

Late fee for rabbits will be \$2. Change rule #8 to released at noon. Matt Davis moved to omit rabbits in the entry fee raise since their premiums are lower. Colleen Abbott seconded the motion. Motion passed. Premiums are Blue \$2.25, Red \$1.75, and White \$1.25.

Poultry

Jason Long moved that poultry premiums be \$4-Blue, \$3-Red, \$2-White with no grand or reserve premiums. Bob Looten seconded. Motion passed. Jennifer Kempker moved to have grand and reserve champion rabbits and poultry receive \$10 and \$5 premiums. Colleen Abbott seconded. Motioned passed.

Goats/Sheep

Gary Looten moved to have sheep dry and without sweats when weighing in. Bob Looten seconded. Motion passed. Rule #20 'dry' was bolded and "No sweats when weighing" was added.

Swine

Dennis Limbach moved to do away with ear tags and use ear notches for identification. Brian Schneider seconded. Motion passed. Ear tags will only be used for pigs without notches. Pigs will be painted in order of weighing at the fair.

Cattle

After discussion of State Fair rules and new halters with sharp objects to make cattle walk with their heads up, Colleen Abbott moved that there be no sharp objects on halters. Second by Bob Looten and motion passed. This was added to rule #15.

There was discussion of duplicate eartags and possible mistakes being made the night of the sale. It was also discussed to put eartags in all animals. No motions were made and duplicate numbers will be taken care of at the fair if there is an issue.

Clarified rule #7 that steers "may be" mouthed instead of "will be" mouthed since this is not as common of a practice as it once was, but the chairman reserves the right to mouth any animal that seems to be older than allowed.

Sale

Matt Davis was added to the Sale Floor Committee by acclamation. There was discussion about the floor price system. It was decided that the committee should do what was in the best interest of the exhibitors. Jennifer Kempker also brought up the possibility to sale advertising on the metal wall beside the arena. Sponsorships for the rate of gain winners was also brought up, as well as, a possible stockholder donation to the fair. These people would be recognized as fair supporters.

Pre-registration

Discussion about the registration form included having the parents' names, the address, a phone number during the fair, and a sign off so that signatures do not have to be collected the night of the fair. The form will be distributed to ag advisors, 4-H leaders, at the extension office, and will be available on the website millercountyfair.com. Entries will be mailed to Colleen Abbott for data entry.

Meeting adjourned at 8:36pm.
